Description of Project Work/Progress for this Quarter (include Task Number):

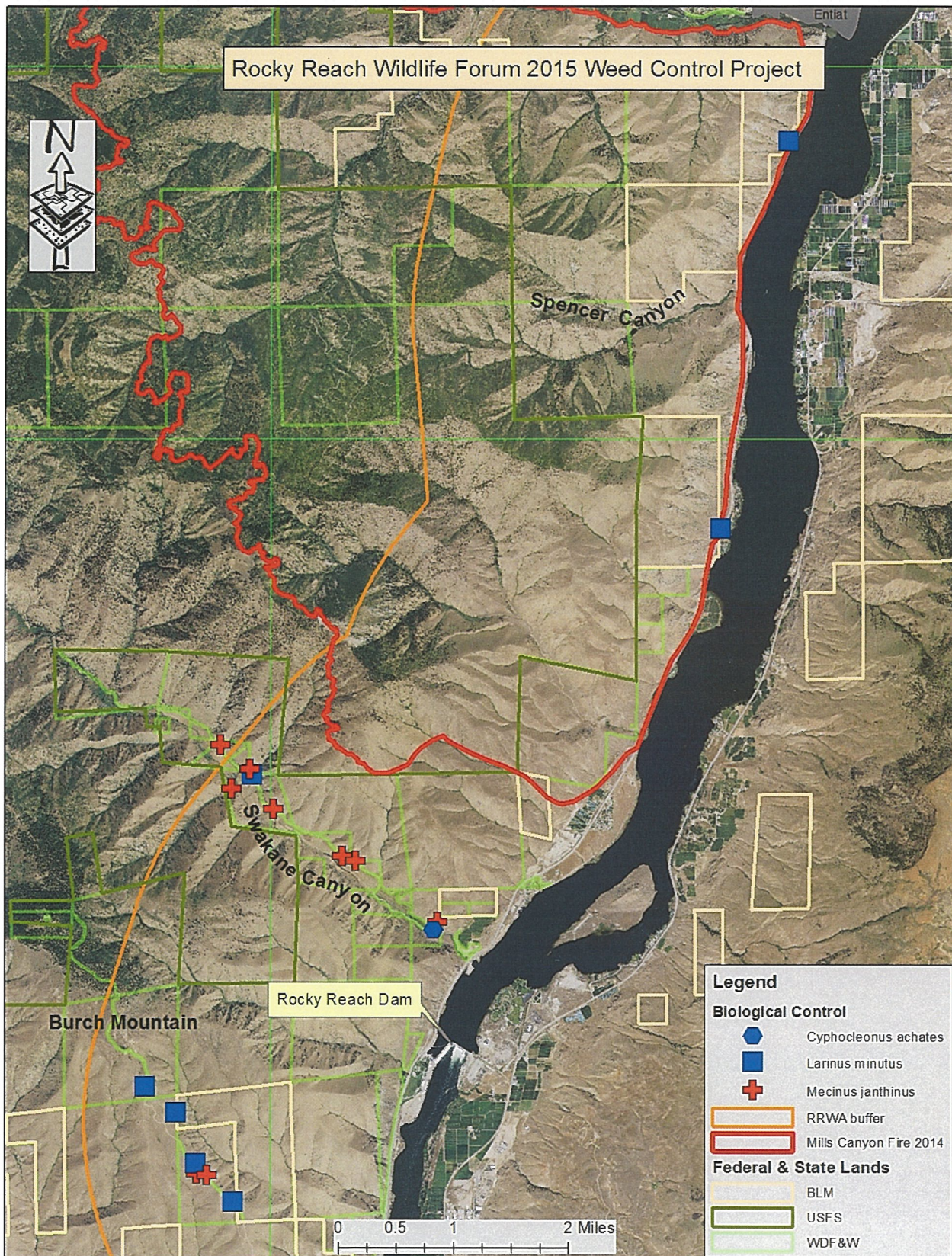


Figure 1. Release sites for biological controls for diffuse knapweed and Dalmatian toadflax by WSU Extension via the Rocky Reach Wildlife Forum, 2015.

Year 2015: As requested by the Rocky Reach Wildlife Forum, Chelan PUD distributed 19,425 biological control insects including; 7,910 seedhead weevils (*Larinus minutus*) and 25 root weevils (*Cyphocleonus achetes*) to control diffuse knapweed and 11,500 stem-mining weevils (*Mecinus janthinus*) to control Dalmatian toadflax on public lands (Table 1) between the Burch Mountain and the Entiat River and (Figure 1) within the Rocky Reach Wildlife Area. Collection and distribution of biological controls was conducted by the Washington State University Extension as evidenced by the attached invoices for a total cost of \$18,000. In addition, Chelan PUD purchased \$1,999.54 of native grass seeds for reseeding severe burn areas in the Mill Canyon Fire within the Rocky Reach Wildlife Area. The seed purchase has a \$279.94 material overhead charge bringing the total seed purchase to \$2,279.48

A total of 11,500 <i>Mecinus janthinus</i> (stem-mining weevil) for Dalmatian toadflax, 7,910 <i>Larinus minutus</i> (seed head feeder) and 25 <i>Cyphocleonus achates</i> (root weevil) both for Diffuse and Spotted knapweed and were released at various locations within the defined project area. Meeting Purpose: Meeting of the Rocky Reach Wildlife Forum to continue Rocky Reach license implementation

Minutes

Von Pope, Chelan PUD, welcomed everyone to the Rocky Reach Wildlife Forum (RRWF) meeting and made known that voice recording of the meeting was initiated for note-taking purposes.

The agenda was amended to include some additions and fix errors. The revised agenda is attached

Von reviewed the 30 June 2015 meeting minutes. No comments had been received; therefore, the meeting minutes were considered final on August 1, 2015.

Von noted that the 2016 – 2020 Rocky Reach Wildlife Habitat Management Plan and 2010-2015 Summary Report was submitted to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) on 17 September 2015.

Integrated Noxious Weed Plan

Review 2015 Weed Management Work

As requested by the Rocky Reach Wildlife Forum, 19,425 biological control insects were released to control Dalmatian toadflax and diffuse knapweed on public lands between the Burch Mountain and the Entiat River within the Rocky Reach Wildlife Area (RRWA). Collection and distribution of biological controls were conducted by the Washington State University Extension. In addition, Chelan PUD purchased \$1,999.54 of native grass seeds for reseeding severe burn areas in the Mill Canyon Fire within the RRWA. The seed purchase has a \$279.94 material overhead charge bringing the total seed purchase to \$2279.48.

The total invoice is for \$20,279.48, which is \$279.94 more than what was authorized in the approved 2015 Project Plan. Von suggested two options to resolve this:

- Amend the 2015 Project Plan, “not to exceed” amount,
- OR
- Resubmit the invoice for the amount of \$20,000 (Chelan PUD would pay the difference).

After discussion, the attending members supported the 2015 Project Plan language to be amended to “not to exceed \$20,000 with a contingency of 5%”. The RRWF also recommended that “not to exceed \$20,000 with a contingency of 5%” be added to future weed control project funded proposals.

The 2015 invoice as submitted was approved by the attending RRWF for payment with the amendment to the 2015 Project Plan.

It was noted that the location data, GIS points and any additional data that is collected for each individual release, (wood stakes marked release sites, and digital photos that were taken of each release of the biological control insects) should be requested from the Washington State University Extension. The RRWF see the importance to have the ability to review the location data of the biological releases. This data would help the agencies monitor success from biological control insect releases.

Dave Volsen, WDFW, recommended that RRWF retain the rights to the biological release data from the WSU contract.

After discussion, the RRWF noted that a map showing all releases conducted to date needs to be provided to the RRWF in order for members to give direction/recommendation as to where the future biological releases should occur.

2016 Project Plan:

In order to start the 2016 project plan the Chelan PUD will develop a map summarizing all weed control work completed to date; including all the biological control release sites and chemical control sites. The map(s) will also include the Chelan Complex and Mills Canyon fire boundaries, land ownership, and RRWA project boundary. This map will be provided to the RRWF to aid in developing the 2016 project proposal as well as future proposals.

Von noted that the payment agreement plans expire 31 December 2015. Chelan PUD is drafting the 2016 payment agreement consistent with the 2016-2020 Wildlife Habitat Management Plan, which cannot be signed until the 2016 – 2020 Rocky Reach Wildlife Habitat Management Plan has FERC approval. To ensure the ability to perform work and allow billing during the 2016 1st quarter, Chelan PUD is also drafting extensions for WDFW and USDA-FS for their 2015 work. This extension would only change the date. Funds and terms would remain the same. Erik Ellis, BLM, stated that BLM will not need an extension, as his agency does not plan to do any work during the 2016 1st quarter. Therefore, Chelan PUD will be prepared with extensions and new 2016 payment agreements, whichever one is needed.

Von indicated that Chelan PUD is in the process of filing a correction (errata) to the 17 September 2015 filed Wildlife Habitat Management Plan (2016-2020) with FERC. During recent agencies' discussions to prepare implementation and budgeting of the plan pending Commission's approval, Chelan PUD discovered the following errors:

1. On page 20, the Figure 4-6: Swakane Area Habitat Projects, BLM (Page 20) is a duplicate of Figure 4-5.
2. On pages 31-32, the first row of the Table 7-1: Fiscal Table did not include the proposed funding provisions for the WDFW's Task 2: Swakane work of \$169,878.00, which in turn affects the “balance available” and “total with NPV” dollars as of December 31, 2020.
3. On pages 24 and 25, replace Figure 4-7 and 4-8 with updated maps as they contain geographical areas referenced in the report text.

These corrections do not change the work planned as described in the remaining document.

2016 Wildlife Monitoring Effort

Von explained that the bald eagle surveys (wintering and nesting monitoring) are continuing under the current 2015 Wildlife Monitoring Plan schedule until the new 5-year Plan Wildlife Management Plan is approved by FERC. Once the new 5 –year Plan is approved by FERC, monthly winter bald eagle surveys will be reduced from five surveys to one survey in January as scheduled in the 2016 Wildlife Monitoring Plan. This survey schedule will coincide with the National Mid-winter Bald Eagle Survey done every January. Due to fewer winter bald eagle surveys, funds could be available for consideration for other wildlife monitoring within the Rocky Reach Wildlife area (RRWA). Proposals would be limited to wildlife species and habitat that are present in the RRWA.

Dave Volsen suggested that the new annual plan format would be a great opportunity for focused species surveys, perhaps by using the WDFW Diversity technicians (non-game spp.). However, Volsen indicated that he had not discussed the need for continued Canada goose nest surveys along Rocky Reach Reservoir. Volsen proposes to continue the wildlife monitoring as done under the first Rocky Reach Wildlife Management Plan including goose nest surveys and bald eagle nest monitoring for 2016. Volsen asked Pope if PUD CPI rates were tracking the actual costs doing the wildlife surveys, Pope indicated it should be within 10%. Dropping down to 1 Bald eagle winter survey in 2016 should free up some money to perhaps include some survey work for the Diversity technicians, but Volsen will meet with the waterfowl biologist during the first week of December to get a better understanding of need for goose nest surveys before proposing any work for 2016.

For the 2016 Wildlife monitoring effort, the current proposal is to continue with Canada goose nest monitoring , bald eagle nest monitoring, and wintering bald eagle surveys under the current 5-year Plan until the new survey schedule is approved by the FERC in the 2nd 5-Year Plan.

Action Items:

- Von will draft an amendment for the 2015 weed control Proposal to accommodate the 2015 invoice.
- 4 December 2015: Kelly will draft a map of all biological control release locations by target weed species and road spray work and send to the RRWF.
- 11 December 2015: agencies will provide locations and proposed budgets for 2016 weed control proposals.
- 31 December 2015: Von will draft and email the 2016 Wildlife Plan (with budgets) and the Integrated Noxious Weed Plan to RRWF for their review and comments.
- Von will determine if the biological insect control release site data collected by WSU can be shared with the RRWF electronically.

Next Steps:

The next regular annual RRWF meeting will be **8 November 2016** from 9:00 a.m. – 12:00 noon in the Chelan PUD Headquarters. Noxious weed invoices for 2016 will be reviewed, wildlife work for 2017 will be proposed, and proposals for noxious weed control in 2017 will be considered.

Review 6/30/2015 RRWF Meeting Minutes
