## RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CHANGES TO THE FUNDS APPROVAL PROCESS FOR SERVICES AGREEMENT (SA) NO. 08-050 WITH ACCU-READ, INC., OF SPOKANE, WA TO CONTINUE TO PROVIDE METER READING SERVICES

## FACTUAL BACKGROUND AND REASONS FOR ACTION

On April 4, 2008, the District issued a request for proposals for contract meter reading services. The District received one proposal from Accu-Read, Inc. of Spokane, WA (Accu-Read).

Resolution No. 08-13328 dated May 12, 2008 authorized Services Agreement (SA) No. 08-050 with Accu-Read to provide Meter Reading Services, in an amount not to exceed that approved in annual budgets.

On May 16, 2008, the District entered into SA No. 08-050 with Accu-Read to perform the services for an initial two year term at the billing rates set forth in the SA. The actual cost for the initial two year term was \$805,268.50. The agreement allows extensions by addition of one year terms, or a portion thereof, and the District and Accu-Read have mutually agreed to continuing services annually since.

Amendment Nos. 1 through 11 result in a \$3,401,654.89 net increase in cost for a new revised estimated total cost of \$4,206,922.39 (excluding sales tax) and an additional \$560,000 was approved in the 2017 budget.

The existing authorization to contract for services not to exceed the amounts approved in the annual budgets is not effective for contract monitoring as the contract is not on the same fiscal year as the budget, the contract utilization varies seasonally, and contract rates are tied to the District's Collective Bargaining Agreement and IRS mileage rates. District staff has identified the need to establish internal not-to-exceed amounts for continuing meter reading services under SA No. 08-050.

District staff recommends that it is in the best interest of the District to establish an internal not-to-exceed amount of \$7,250,000. The District's progress on the two-way metering project may impact the rate of spend on this contract but it is estimated this amount will cover five annual contract renewals beginning in May 2017.

**ACTION** 

The General Manager has reviewed District staff's recommendation and concurs in the same.

# IT IS RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSION OF PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT NO. 1 OF CHELAN COUNTY, WASHINGTON as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The General Manager is hereby authorized to execute annual contract renewals for meter reading services with Accu-Read, Inc. The revised contract spend which includes past and future services will not exceed \$7,250,000 without prior Commission approval.
