Current System

- 3500 square mile service area (largest in Washington State)
- Serves 10 urban areas
- 550 route miles
- 600 bus stops
- 2.2 million miles traveled per year
- 40% of population within ¼ mile of service
- 58% of population within ¾ mile of service
- Buses run Monday through Saturday


System Performance



One of 11 systems (out of 377) nationwide to achieve all six Federal performance measures

Cost per hour of service is 25% lower than the state average

Who Are Our Riders?

- 50% riding for 2+ years, 18% riding for 10+ years
- 55% riding to work, 25% riding to school
- 32% would have driven self if transit was not available
- 17% would not have traveled if transit was not available
- 48% employed full time, 23% are students
- 32% are 45+, 53% are 34 or younger
- 53% are male, 47% are female

Environmental Footprint

- Largest % alternative fueled transit fleet in the Northwest
- 42 Propane powered vehicles
 - 16% reduction in greenhouse gases
 - 99% reduction in other pollutants
 - 65% less cost than gasoline
- 10 Battery electric buses
 - zero emission
 - ½ cost of diesel buses
- Wireless vehicle charger First in world 200KW
- LED lights, high efficiency cooling, water recycling reducing utility costs

What Will It Cost?

- Will generate an additional \$5.5 million per year
- Equal to 0.2% (2 cents per ten dollar purchase)
- For average household, \$24.00 per year
- Per person \$8.88 per year
