Philosophy

- Simplify rates and align costs with drivers by charging based on a "measured usage" component
- Provide an incentive to Service Providers to reach more homes and businesses than today
- Support revenue at current levels and grow revenue as usage requires additional investment



Revenue Requirement

- Total Revenue Forecast
- Core Services Revenue
 - Revenue from fixed rates
 - Revenue from bandwidth

\$5,187,000

\$9,572,000

- 2,849,687
 - 2,337,313

- Sample rate calculation
 - Rev_{BW} / 12 / Bandwidth(GB)
 - -\$2,337,313 / 12 / 2,496,375 = \$.0780/GB



When is Board action required?

- Rate increases or decreases
 - A change to increase/decrease a fixed rate
 - A change to produce incremental (new) revenue from the aggregated bandwidth rate
- An increase of more than 5% in the aggregate bandwidth rate year over year
 - May or may not be a rate increase



Program

- This is a different approach
 - Designed to break the high-cost barrier
 - Requires continued evaluation
 - May require fine tuning
- Requires regular communications with service providers
- Includes updates to the Board on regular intervals

Resolution

- Rate structure additions and changes to Core Service offerings
- Restructuring of VLAN services
- Increase of 10% to all Dark Fiber Pathway rates
- Addition of Coarse Wave Division Multiplex (CWDM) services
- Does not include any changes to Non-Recurring Charges or Fees



Summary

- Broadband Rate Design for Public Benefit
- This is a new approach to break the cost barrier on Fiber based broadband services
- Offers service providers flexibility
- Program updates to keep the Board informed
- Continues management of broadband revenues
