
Why Are We Here?

- 1st of two updates each year
- Consider allocating remaining \$3.5M for 2020
- Planting seeds for 2021 \$6M



The Best for the Most for the Longest: 2020 Highlights

- Jobs Readiness: Supported Employment pilot
- Rocky Reach Discovery Center in-flight
- Day Use Parks Pass: 1,300 issued before Memorial Day
- Fiber: continued expansion and infill (see below)





The Best for the Most for the Longest: Since Launch

<u>Fiber</u>

• County coverage at 76% with PPB funding 3,400+ premises passed

<u>Parks</u>

• 9,000 Day Use Passes issued; now funded through 2022

Hydro Research Institute

• Established in 2018. Data from 8 plants uploaded; target 17 by Q2.

Rocky Reach Museum and Discovery Center

Said goodbye November 2019; grand re-opening in spring 2021

Jobs and Work Readiness

• First position extended to 2020 YE; second started December 2019



Financial Funding Formula

- March 30, 2020: Board reviewed PPB's financial criteria
- April 13, 2020:
 - Board approved resolution on PPB's financial funding formula
 - -2020-2024 PPB funding = \$6M
