## Meeting No. 3 – March 1, 2016 North Shore Chelan Substation Community Focus Group

## 1. Meeting Summary:

- Gary and Chad presented the evaluation matrix which was populated by PUD staff between meetings 2 and 3
- PUD staff calculated the ratings in a few different ways and found that the overall scoring was similar among each
  of the different calculation methods
- Focus group members provided input on the evaluation matrix and ratings were modified accordingly
- Gary proposed a narrowing method which the group agreed to use
- After applying the focus group input, the narrowing method resulted in the following:
  - o Parking lot areas 3, 4 6, 12, 14, 16, 18
    - These areas scored a 1 or 2 (low) in either System Considerations or Aesthetics
    - They were moved to a parking lot not removed from the list
    - If needed, we can further evaluate these areas later in the process
  - o Middle areas 2, 5, 11, 15, 17
    - These areas had a low total scoring
    - If needed, we can further evaluate these areas later in the process
  - High areas 7, 13, 9, 10, 1, 8
    - These areas had the highest total scoring
    - Listed in the order in which they scored
- The original objective of the focus group is to identify a "Top 3"
- The focus group reevaluated and validated the ratings for the high scoring areas
- The focus group determined PUD staff should further evaluate the following three areas: 7, 13, and 9/10
- Steve Firman, Fred Cleveland, and Tom Anglin went on a tour of the Southshore Substation with PUD staff

## 2. Next steps and action items

- PUD staff will meet with PUD Lands Department (Lands) to discuss the three areas
  - PUD staff met with Lands on March 9<sup>th</sup>
- Lands performed early discovery work on the three areas
  - High level assessment of lands conditions and zoning
- Lands will populate a blank site evaluation matrix for each of the three areas
  - o Lands will also perform an assessment of available property within each of the areas
- Then, Lands will do an assessment of parcels within each of the areas
  - Determine how sites within each of the parcels rates on the evaluation matrix
- At the next focus group meeting, PUD staff will present Lands assessment for focus group discussion.
- \* Lands nor PUD staff will contact property owners in/around the three areas at this time

The following activities and timeline will be discussed at the next focus group meeting:

- Q2 2016 Engage the community/property owners in and adjacent to the three areas early notification
- Q2 2016 Engage the community as whole through a community meeting
- Q2 2016 Focus group determines the "sites" which the consultant will evaluate
- Q2 2016 PUD staff will work with consultant for detailed evaluation of the proposed "sites"
- June 2016 Focus group and PUD staff present proposed "site" options to PUD Commissioners
