


# Background

- Initiative 937 was approved by WA voters in 2006
- Added to Title 19 RCW in 2007
- Requires utilities with more than 25,000 customers to acquire all cost-effective conservation
- Accomplished by setting a two-year target and developing a ten-year plan via a Conservation Potential Assessment
- 197-37 WAC outlines the methods to develop conservation targets and the reporting requirements

# Conservation Potential Assessment Results


#### Cost-Effective Energy Savings Potential by Sector (aMW)

Sector	2022/2023	2024/2025	4-Year	10-Year	20-Year
Residential	0.18	0.41	1.07	4.92	10.65
Commercial	1.02	1.29	2.83	8.04	15.80
Industrial	0.46	0.90	2.03	5.43	7.67
Utility	0.00	0.06	0.20	1.31	2.48
Agricultural	0.02	0.01	0.02	0.16	0.29
Total	1.68	2.67	6.15	19.85	36.89



# What makes up the target

#### Percent of 2024/2025 Target by Sector



- Commercial/Industrial sector ~ 80%
- Major focus areas:
  - HVAC measures: All sectors
  - Commercial/Industrial
    Lighting
  - Weatherization
    - Including low-income
  - Northwest Energy Efficiency Alliance



### Primary Driver of Increased Potential


- Increase in energy market value
  - Market value in 2022/2023 CPA-\$39/MWh
  - Market value in 2024/2025 CPA-\$65/MWh

 Leads to increase in amount of cost-effective conservation potential



# Proposed 10-Year Plan and 2-Year Target

Two-Year Target and 10-Year Conservation Plan





# Discussion

- Target is larger than last compliance period
  - Still within range of historic targets
  - High confidence compliance target will be achieved
    - Mix of measures
    - Northwest Energy Efficiency Alliance funding provides a strong base level of savings
    - We can use "banked" savings
      - Use a portion of overachievement from past periods to meet current targets if needed
