Weatherization incentives



- Program began Jan. 1
 - 25¢ per sf for insulation
 - \$3 per sf for energy-efficient windows
 - Customers are very interested
 - Logged 76 e-mail inquiries and 45 phone contacts
 - 3 incentives are in payment process
 - 5% of overall target
 - Budget = \$150,000

Low-Income Weatherization



- Continuing our long-running partnership with Community Action
 - \$65,000 annual grant
 - Addition of CFLs valued at approx. \$2,200
 - 3% of overall program
 - Budget = \$67,200

CFL Distribution



- Program to begin Feb. 8
 - 41,000 compact fluorescent light bulbs
 - Community Action Council – 7,200
 - PUD – 33,800
 - New, high-quality, 13-watt bulbs (equiv. to 60W)
 - 9% of overall target
 - Budget = \$54,905

CFL recycling



- Setting up CFL recycling bins at 3 PUD offices
 - Small lamps only (no tubes)
 - Janitorial crew will collect as needed
 - Ecolights, certified environmental handler, will pick up as part of existing service
 - Not anticipating large numbers
 - Mercury issue identified; staff training



Change-a-Light

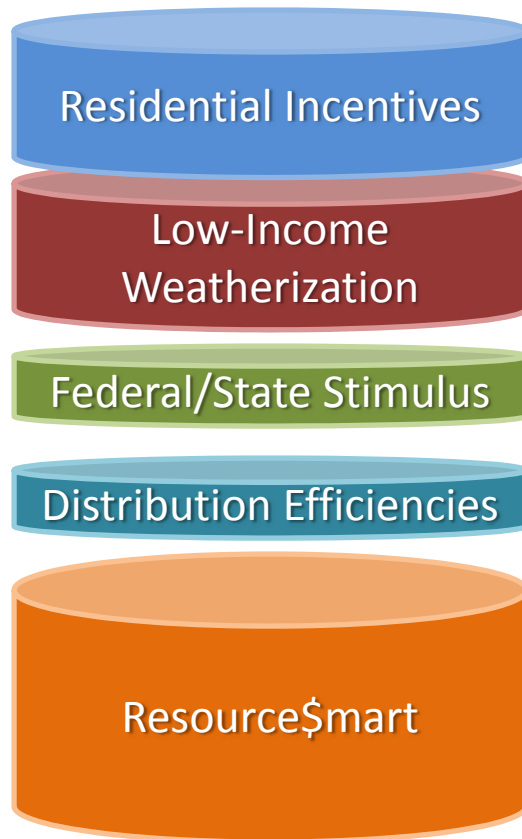


- Buydown in stores of specialty lamps
 - Dimmable, 3-way, candelabra, flood lamps
 - BPA sponsored; most utilities in region already taking part
 - Contract with third party already working in region
 - 4% of target
 - Budget = \$27,132
