First Draft Comment Summary

RESPONSES TO IAC COMMENTS DATED NOV 2, 2000:

Comment: 1.6, regional population. While the population may be described as "sparse," there has been visible evidence of population growth in recent years, especially in terms of private residences adjacent to the project boundary. A discussion of population changes over the life of the original license could help explain this evidence.

Response: Agree, this will be added to the report.

Comment: 1.8, overview of current land management plans, etc. The last paragraph notes that Chelan PUD uses a permit system to assess and track land uses within the project boundaries. A matrix of current permits, proposed permits, and perhaps discussion of permit policies and procedures, would be helpful.

Response: Agree, this will be added to the report.

Comment: 1.9, current recreational development. The text concerning recreation development is fine. In the next draft, I would expect to see additional sections addressing other PUD developments and activities, such as power generation, transmission lines, fish facilities including hatcheries, any wildlife lands associated with the project, and a description of flowage easements including a definition and general locations.

Response: Agree, this will be added to the report.

Comment: 4.3, A map or maps of shoreline ownership will be very useful when available.

Response: Maps will be included when they are completed (estimated for June 30, 2001)

Comment: Appendix A, land management matrix. I would like to see a column for the PUD's policies, if any, concerning the various activities.

Response: Chelan PUD will provide information in the report related to its policies and procedures.

Comment: Appendix B, permitting resource guide. I would like to see a description of the PUD's policies and procedures concerning developments it controls (see 1.8, above).

Response: Agree, this will be added to the report.
