

In other business, commissioners:

- Heard an update on how the PUD is working with the community, agencies and tribes to redraft proposed conditions for a federal license for Rocky Reach Dam. In August, Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) staff accepted all but 3 percent of proposed measures for a new, long-term license. However, that left out two recreation measures and six wildlife proposals. Gregg Carrington, hydro services director, said PUD staff are working with community members, agency and tribal representatives to develop new measures that will meet FERC's criteria that they be within the project boundary. Included in the measures rejected by FERC were new ballfields for Entiat, a Recreation Enhancement Fund for projects on reservoirs and tributaries, and a study of Pacific lamprey.

The next regular meeting of the PUD Board of Commissioners is at 10 a.m. on Monday, Nov. 7, in the PUD boardroom at 327 N. Wenatchee Ave.
