Questions arose regarding employee access and proximity to electrical equipment on the deck of both Rock Island powerhouses as well as Rocky Reach. Governing rules for these facilities are covered in the National Electric Safety Code (NESC). Christopher performed an in-depth review of the NESC as it applies to this equipment and the various classes of workers who have access to the equipment. Christopher wrote a white paper on the subject and hired a highly qualified NESC consultant to review the work and provide additional recommendations. The consultant agreed with the conclusions that Christopher laid out in the report and provided a few additional recommendations. Christopher's work helped clarify the requirements regarding authorized access to these areas and confirmed the clearances to energized equipment meet the NESC rules.
