Installed five PUD-owned Electric Vehicle (EV) chargers at Chelan PUD locations


- » Public-private partnership allows free EV charging by employees and the public

Participated in regional study of impact of vehicle electrification with four utilities (Avista, Snohomish PUD, Tacoma and Puget Sound Energy)


Based on findings, conducted additional study with Western Washington University

REGIONAL STUDY FINDINGS


EV ownership provides positive benefits to the region and customers

EV ownership provides net positive benefit to most electric utilities except Chelan PUD

Increase in retail sale of electricity to EV owners does not cover the reduction in wholesale revenue and distribution costs.




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



PER VEHICLE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES ON CHELAN COUNTY PUD BALANCE SHEET




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


BENEFITS INCREMENTAL UTILITY REVENUE





INCREMENTAL UTILITY REVENUE



Options to Reduce Impacts to Chelan PUD

POLICY OPTIONS

Rate Design »Time-of-Use rate

»Specific EV charger rate

Legislation to reduce costs and/or increase benefits to Chelan PUD »Utility-use tax credits

»Carbon tax

»Access to VW settlement funds





WESTERN WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY FINDINGS Options to Reduce Impacts to Chelan PUD

»Load control of EV chargers

»Stand-alone PUD-owned public EV chargers

»Behind-the-meter PUD-owned EV chargers

»Education and outreach on "smart charging"

There is also a "do nothing" option; view the load as Chelan PUD views any other organic load growth.
