

2022 Election Results


- 12th District: Reps. Steele and Goehner reelected (Sen. Hawkins up in 2024)



- Begins Jan. 9
- Back in-person (mostly)
- Budget year
 - Operating, Capital and Transportation
 - The Governor is expected to release budget proposal soon
- Budget drivers: Inflation and uncertainty temper positive revenue forecast
- Mid-C collaboration

- Protecting the Public Works Assistance Account
- Federal funding requirements

Other Issues

- Implementation of Climate Commitment Act (CCA), Clean Energy Transformation Act (CETA)

- Building electrification
- Long term care program
- Paid Family Medical Leave



Federal Funding

- Funding passed in American Rescue Plan, Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and other federal laws is beginning to roll out, much coming through state agencies.
- Regulatory requirements attached to the funding are a barrier for many entities.
- The District now has a process to evaluate funding opportunities and decide whether to apply.
- External Affairs will focus on funding opportunities in key areas (water, broadband, dam safety, wildfire mitigation).
