NCW Tech Alliance

- Blake Baldwin, Director of Operations, reviewed mission, passion, service area, focus on technology, entrepreneurship, and STEM education, team and board, and new organizational structure
- Reviewed programs including cyber meetups, UpSkill which will be moving to a national platform, Flywheel
 investment conference, and Project iLumina (digital inclusion, digital transformation, rural leadership
 development, and entrepreneurial innovation)
- Partnering with other agencies on the Our Valley Our Future Technology Ecosystem Gamechanger project

Legislative Session Review and Perspectives from the Tri-Commission

- Dave Arbaugh, Lobbyist, reviewed the legislative session
- PUD was monitoring customer assistance, \$100M was included in the budget; also included was funding for:
 - o Lower Snake River Dam study
 - o Broadband deployment
- Discussed other bills of interest that were not approved during the session
- Anticipate potential changes in the legislature during the next election cycle
- Representative Goehner discussed budget
 - o Significance in supplemental budget was a 24% increase in the budget

Tri-Commission Updates

- Chelan County PUD
 - o Service Center and 5th Street Campus Redevelopment Update
 - Service Center work is ongoing; building A on schedule for completion late this year or early next year
 - Behind that building are operations buildings that will be completed on staggered schedules through 2023
 - Currently have an RFP out for 5th Street Redevelopment in partnership with the Regional Port Authority; anticipate award and negotiations over the summer
 - o Notice: Confluence Parkway Open House March 30 @ CTC
 - Two walking tours and two open houses tomorrow
 - Online survey is available for feedback
- Chelan County Commission
 - o Regional Mental Health Facility is underway with a workgroup across four counties
 - Goal is to open a behavioral health unit in Chelan County
 - Also looking at stabilization centers in more remote areas for individuals prior to transportation to the regional facility
 - Will be asking voters for a 1/10 percent tax to fund this facility and service
 - o Cascade Public Infrastructure Fund Grant
 - Will go live June 6 to fund infrastructure projects that support economic development and affordable housing
 - ARPA dollars have contracted with Moss Adams to advise on how to prioritize and spend funds along with meeting reporting requirements
 - In April, will complete internal surveys to prioritize spending, followed by Commissioner workshops on how to prioritize
 - Will then provide opportunities for community feedback on priorities
 - o Organizational Assessment
 - The County has recently assumed additional responsibilities; in addition have seen expanding roles and responsibilities for various departments

- Consultant to evaluate structure; report will be available in April
- o Update on Facilities Plan
 - Engaging Beeman Architecture to develop recommendation for next 20-year facilities plan; plan will be broken into four 5-year plans to allow inclusion of emerging technologies and new funding opportunities
- Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority
 - o Airport Update
 - Reviewed projects underway and future FAA-funded projects
 - Alaska Airlines is retiring their fleet of Q400s; Wenatche will be serviced by E175 jets in 2023


- Laura Merrill, Wenatchee Executive Services Director
 - o Confluence Parkway is a large focus for the city and region
 - o Consultant working on redevelopment plan for former State Patrol location
- Bob Goedde, Chelan Mayor
 - o Thanks to Rep. Steele for support of infrastructure for Chelan Airport enlargement
 - o Putting water and sewer main in two alleys downtown
 - o Have started on new public works building
 - o Community interest in making the Woodin bridge 2 way and discussion on Woodin Avenue updates
 - o Property developer has purchased land near Walmart and anticipated to add apartments
- Carl Florea, Leavenworth
 - o Working with Chelan County to look at urban growth area
 - o Working with Senator Hawkins on affordable housing under Community Economic Development tax
 - o Received funding through Rep. Schrier for an affordable housing pilot project with a local contractor
- Mayor Fletcher, Cashmere
 - o Held a community forum with ~100 people to discuss the future of Cashmere
 - Community wants to see more trails, possibly moving library to Riverside Center, refurbishing river access
 - o West Cashmere Bridge anticipated to open at the end of July
 - o City contracted with a firm to manage their utility service

- Jim Kuntz noted that Commissioner Turner has resigned and the Port board is accepting applications for an appointment for the remainder of Commissioner Turner's term
- Welcomed Kirk Hudson as the PUD's new General Manager
