Call To Order

- Chelan County PUD President, Randy Smith, called the meeting to order at 1:03pm
- Justin Erickson led the pledge of allegiance

Tri-Commission Updates

- Chelan County Commission
 - Water Code Update
 - This is an increasingly complex issue; challenges around management of water supply and streamflow
 - Mike Kaputa reviewed the County's new water code, effective April 1
 - Code responds to increased regulatory requirements

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- Cost-effective approach that can be administered at the county level; trying to prevent any closures or moratoriums in basins due to lack of supply
- Chelan Douglas Regional Port Authority
 - Reviewed funding provided under the CARES Act; new grants through the Washington State Department of Commerce opened on Monday for applications
 - Reviewed power delivery rates, noting that large power users approaching the Port would have to be sited in Chelan County
 - o Reviewed business leads that have expressed interest
- Chelan County PUD
 - o Fires Safety Outage Management Plan
 - Developing an outage plan specific to extreme fire conditions; currently engaging community partners
 - Identified Phase I area in Plain, Lake Wenatchee and Coles Corner; wildfire studies converge in this area of highest risk
 - Purpose is to protect people and property by reducing risk of fires started by utility equipment
 - Staff is setting thresholds for wind levels and dry fuel load; want to make information and metrics available to staff and the public
 - Reviewed plan components and outage timeline
 - $\circ\,$ Substation buildout update was included in the packet as information only
 - o Long-Term Marketing Strategy
 - The PUD currently uses a 50/30/20 model (long-term contracts / 5-year slice contracts / local use)
 - The value of long-term sales has been increasing, while the slice product value has decreased
 - There is significant risk in the Pacific Northwest of not having enough supply by 2025 when Clean Energy Transformation Act (CETA) requirements go into effect
 - Plan to move to longer term contracts for the market-based sales portion of our portfolio and changing our approach to cost-based sales
 - Another opportunity are loads interested in locating here that would import their power; Chelan County would realize the benefits of economic development without affecting local ratepayers

Second Water Source Update

- The current water source provides an average of 10MM gallons per day with a capacity of 23MM gallons; studies indicate there will be an adequate supply through 2035-36
- The Regional Water System has been looking for redundancy and resiliency with a second water source on the Chelan County side of the river; drilled a total of 7 wells without success
- Will be working to determine the viability of a surface water treatment plant
- The PUD and Port were able to combine their efforts with a funding request to explore a surface water treatment plan, which Representative Steele has included in the House budget

Legislative Update and Discussion

- Shaun reviewed bills of interest regarding broadband retail authority, forest health, wildfire, carbon, and Open Public Meetings Act
- Commissioner Overbay reviewed bill 1117 adding salmon recovery to the Growth Management Act

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Opportunity

- Significant dollars will be coming to Washington State; thinking about priorities and ideas
 - o PUD Priorities broadband expansion and second water source
 - o County regional jail and other department upgrades; possible need in the agricultural community
 - $\,\circ\,$ City of Wenatchee and Port agrees with PUD priorities
 - $\,\circ\,$ City of Chelan water quality and airport issues
 - The Regional Port supports this priority they would like to see the water line extended to support further development at the airport

• Ideas: to relocate Wenatchee and East Wenatchee wastewater treatment facilities outside of the population centers and funding to remove several underground tanks at Pangborn

Insights from the Mayors

- Frank Kuntz, Wenatchee Mayor
 - $\,\circ\,$ Submitted a fourth infrastructure grant application to fund Confluence Parkway and other projects
 - o Opening city hall to normal activity on April 12
 - o Considering what to do with ARPA funding; may direct some money to help local non-profits
 - $\circ\,$ Engaging with Link and the Port in general discussion on potential transportation lobbying in DC
- Bob Goedde, Chelan Mayor
 - o Chelan fared well last year; real estate excise tax is up
 - Residents have indicated a desire for a place to have music festivals; would like to continue conversations with the PUD on possibly terracing Riverwalk park to allow that use
- Carl Florea, Leavenworth Mayor
 - o Leavenworth returned to normal activity levels in August; focus on being as safe as possible
 - $\circ\,$ Have kept the downtown area closed to car traffic
 - In the middle of major infrastructure upgrades to meet Wenatchee River phosphorus limits
 Received a grant to install smart water meters; will do major assessment of water transmission lines
- Jim Fletcher, Cashmere Mayor
 - o Cashmere has done a soft opening, allowing people into City Hall
 - $\circ\,$ The Association of Washington Cities put out a housing report; local rents are surprising

Commissioner Comments

- Jim Huffman expressed kudos to the PUD for being proactive on a fire hazard program; local representatives have indicated a need at the federal level for a radar station here, which could benefit many efforts
- Bob Bugert noted the County is working with many partners on forest health issues
 - Working with Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest on stewardship contracts for forest thinning as well as a local, small diameter mill, which would be positive for the community and forest health work
- Blake Baldwin reported on the Cascade Public Infrastructure Fund created utilizing a percentage of revenues from County rural taxes
 - An advisory board will advise Commissioners on projects
 - o The fund launches on Monday and information will be available on the Commissioner's website
