- Managing directors reviewed Q1 metrics completed or delayed
- 80.72% of metrics were completed or are on track

Quarterly Financial Review and Investment Report

- Mark Mullins, Director Enterprise Planning and Risk Analytics, Dave Nelson, Manager Strategic Financial Planning, and Heather Irelan, Treasurer, reviewed 1st quarter financial results
- Year-end 2022 forecasts are better than budget Q1 YTD results are better than budget by \$17M
 - o Year-end forecasts anticipate higher revenues and some catch-up in operating expenses which will maintain bottom line, better than budget by \$17M
- Long-term financial metrics remain strong Includes planned borrowing in the next five-year planning horizon to fund a portion of our capital spending program while maintaining our financial metrics

Quarterly Electrical Load Growth Update

- Andy Wendell, Director Customer Service and Stakeholder Outreach, reviewed quarterly load growth
- New construction and redevelopment remain strong, sustained growth in new residential meters for 3 to 5
 years, electrical infrastructure investments are timely, confidence levels around load growth increases with
 improved planning, and District utilities are well positioned to meet demands of growth
- James Graves, Distribution Substation Foreman Wireman, noted that Ohme substations is a flagship substation for us; a lot of people involved in designing this to create a future standard
 Described control house safety features
- Commissioner Bolz noted community concern about all the new construction and whether we will have enough power to meet local needs; he suggested a community education campaign on the topic

Confluence Parkway Due Diligence

 - o The line is funded by the three Mid-Cs and is being constructed by Douglas PUD
 - o The line will alleviate transmission congestion between Rocky Reach and the Columbia substation
 - o Construction is about to begin, and the line is expected to be energized in late 2023
- Justin Erickson, Managing Director District Services, reviewed options for the Public Power Benefit (PPB) project solicitation review process
 - o Commissioners Congdon and McKenna volunteered to work with staff to review the projects

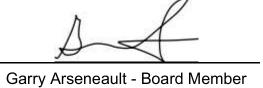
