Manager Item

- Ron Slabaugh, Water/Wastewater Manager, provided a Regional Water System update
 - o Regional Water System continues to work towards a second source water supply
 - An initial report on a surface water treatment plant indicated a cost of \$85-100M based on capacity to meet 20-year demands
 - The City of Wenatchee has committed to validate the 2018 water demand forecast to confirm whether the timeframe remains 2035-2036 for anticipated capacity increases
- Ron Gibbs, Insurance and Risk Management Manager, provided an insurance renewal update
 - o Overall, saw a 17.7% increase in premiums
 - Staff was able to negotiate an increase in earthquake coverage by capping deductible for ~60% of the program
- Shawn Smith, Managing Director Energy Resources, and Janet Jaspers, Director Energy Operations, Planning and Trading, gave an update on results from the recent 5% output slice auction
 - o Janet thanked staff involved in this process
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- o Reviewed terms of the slice contract including environmental attributes
- Puget Sound Energy was awarded the slice auction, based on highest bid
- o Kirk appreciates the work of the team; there is a lot of work that goes into these contracts
- Tracy Yount, Director of External Affairs, introduced Libby Siebens, Communications Manager
- Sarah DeLozier, Supervisor Customer Service and Dispatch, and Lyle Moore, Customer Service Engineering Supervisor, reviewed highlights of the Latecomers policy recommendations and sought feedback
 - Summarized options presented at the last meeting for changes to the Latecomers policy
 - Commissioners provided feedback
 - o Compared recommended policy changes to the current policy and industry standards
 - Next step will be a resolution to change the policy
