

North Central Washington Radar Gap





 There are five active Doppler radars that monitor real-time weather conditions for the state of Washington (Spokane, Pendleton, Langley Hill (Grays Harbor), Camano Island (Seattle), and Portland) that are utilized by the National Weather Service (NWS) to monitor hazardous weather conditions and predict weather.



 None of the five radars have coverage of weather conditions below 10,000 feet in the northeastern slopes of the Cascades. All or part of six (6) counties along the eastern slopes of the Cascades are impacted by the lack of accurate weather radar coverage. As a result, the NWS Doppler radar network has a gap or hole in coverage.









Seattle

- The result of this gap in coverage creates a less reliable weather prediction system for the NWS, thus creating a vulnerability or uncertainty for the residents, businesses, and industries that lie along the eastern slopes of the Cascades and portions of Central Washington.
- The lack of coverage under 10,000 feet impacts the NWS ability to issue timely and accurate emergency alters.
