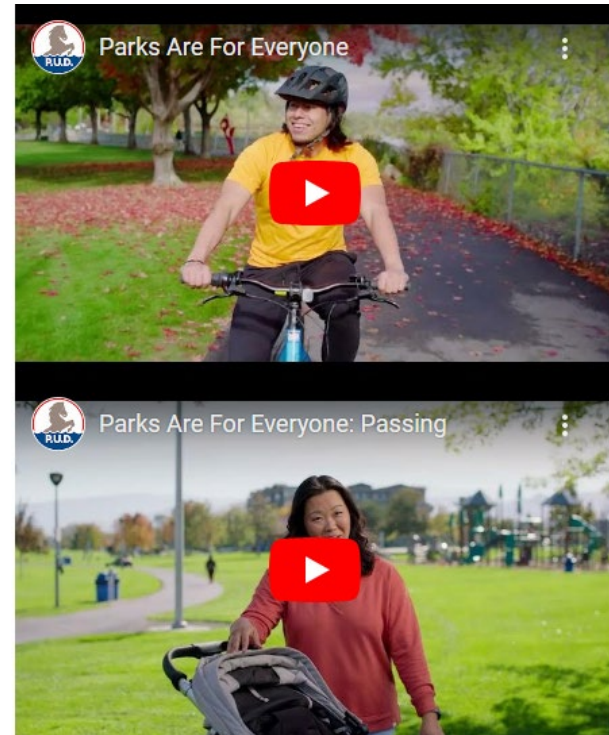

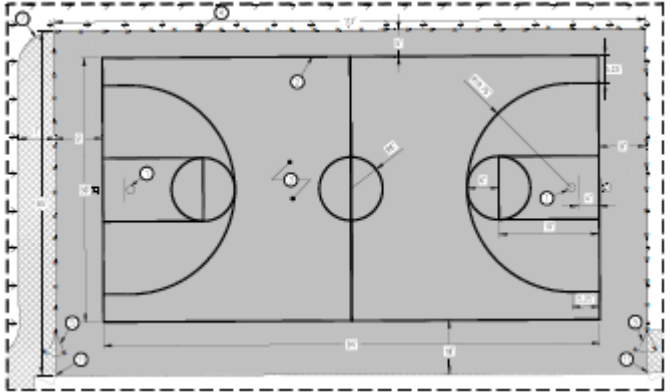
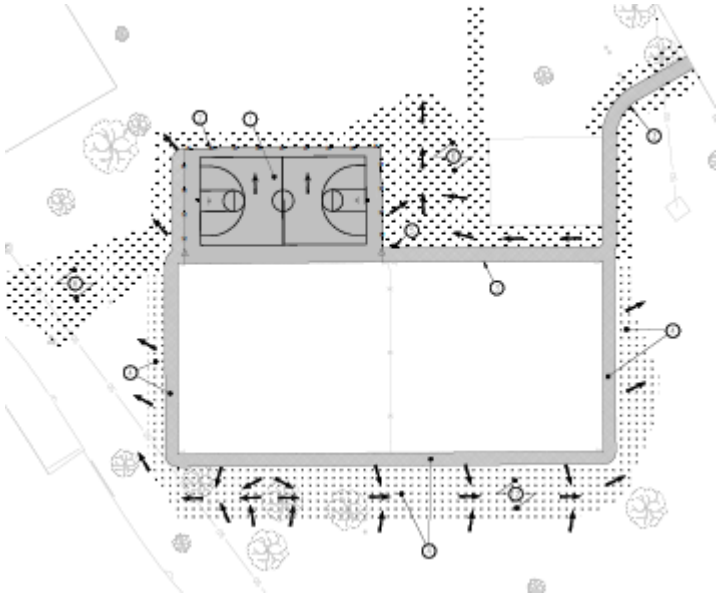


Wenatchee Riverfront Park Master Plan - Phase 1

What does Lands do?

- 50 Substations and switchyards
- 371 Poles, switches, reclosures and platforms fiber and line crews
- 55 Water towers and pump stations
- 25 Technician communication sites
- 10 Fisheries and hatcheries
- Over 200 Fiber and FDT sites
- 13 sites mowing and weed control
