## Peshastin Water District (PWD) Request

- PWD has requested the District take over operations and ownership of the PWD system
- PWD has significant future capital improvement needs and recently implemented a multi-year rate plan to support these investments
- PWD leadership is committed to this effort and PWD outreach to customers indicates support



# Initial Evaluation Approach

- 1. Customer Impact Are customers aware and in support of PUD providing water services in the Peshastin area?
- 2. System Health Are the assets of PWD in a quality operating condition and where not, does PWD have mitigation plans?
- **? 3. Financial Sustainability** Is the financial condition of PWD sustainable? Would the combining of systems impact sustainability for existing PUD water customers?
- ☐ 4. Legal Are there legal hurdles that would impact any of the above or the achievability of acquisition, such as easements, agreements, liabilities, etc.



### Initial Evaluation — Financial Discussion

### Background:

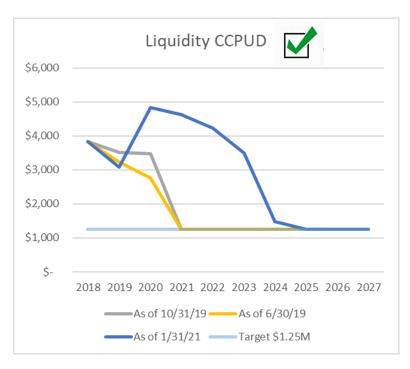
- To implement the District's strategic plan goal of Water system sustainability, staff developed a 10-year plan to achieve financial health
- Monitoring metrics were put in place based on best practices<sup>1</sup> to include:
  - Operating Coverage > 100% plus actual debt service %
  - Debt Service % of Revenue < 10%</p>
  - Liquidity > \$1.25M

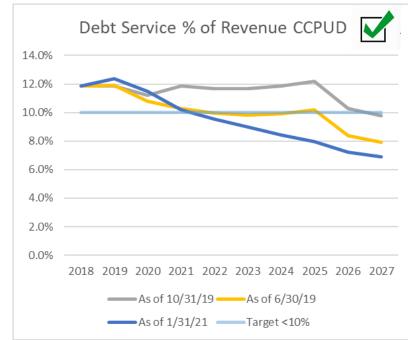


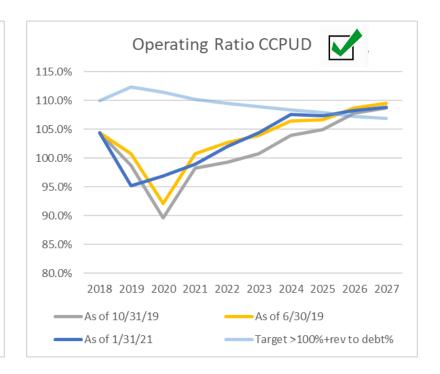

### Status of District sustainability efforts:



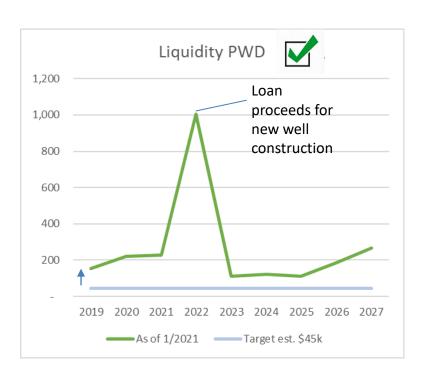


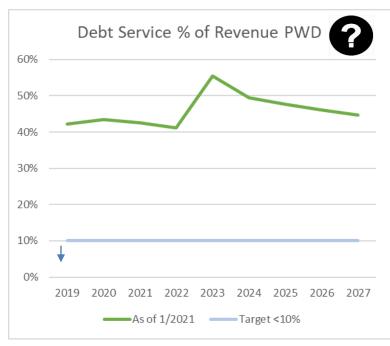


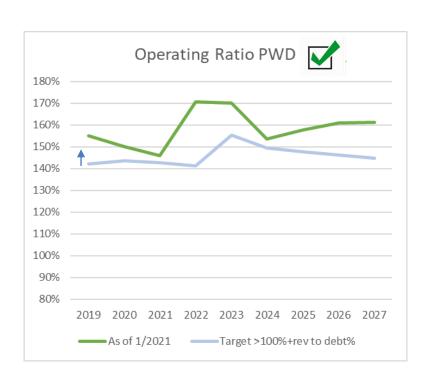


### Initial Evaluation – Financial Discussion

#### PWD financial results







Based on financial budget data and assumptions provided by PWD. Includes PWD rate plan approved January 2021.



### Initial Evaluation — Financial Discussion

- Combining systems could result in additional time required for PUD financial sustainability
  - Debt service % of revenues target would take an additional 7+ years to achieve
  - Operating ratio would take an additional 2+ years to achieve
- Potential opportunities to improve PWD results
  - Fund some improvements via reserves instead of incurring debt
  - Advanced paydown of debt/refinancing
  - Project grant funding or other funding, such as sale of water rights
  - Rate adders for PWD customers (early evaluation indicated additional ~\$5/mo per residential service)



# **Evaluation Considerations/Priorities**

- Acquisition of PWD should have no negative impact on existing District water customers
- PWD customers must support PWD leadership's request
- The District should not take on significant known or unknown risk and thus should perform all necessary due diligence
- Based on other experience of others, this process could take 3+ years; impact to other District goals and priorities should be considered

## Potential Next Steps

- Coordinated outreach with PWD to confirm community support
- Continued review of financial results to quantify potential rate adder impact for PWD customers
- Due diligence field review of system to identify any deficiencies not included in the PWD water system plan update
- Evaluate impact to current District goals and priorities
- Outline roadmap of actions that would be required for success (e.g. land, easements, contracts, loans, agreements, other obligations, etc.)
- Regular check-ins with management and Board
