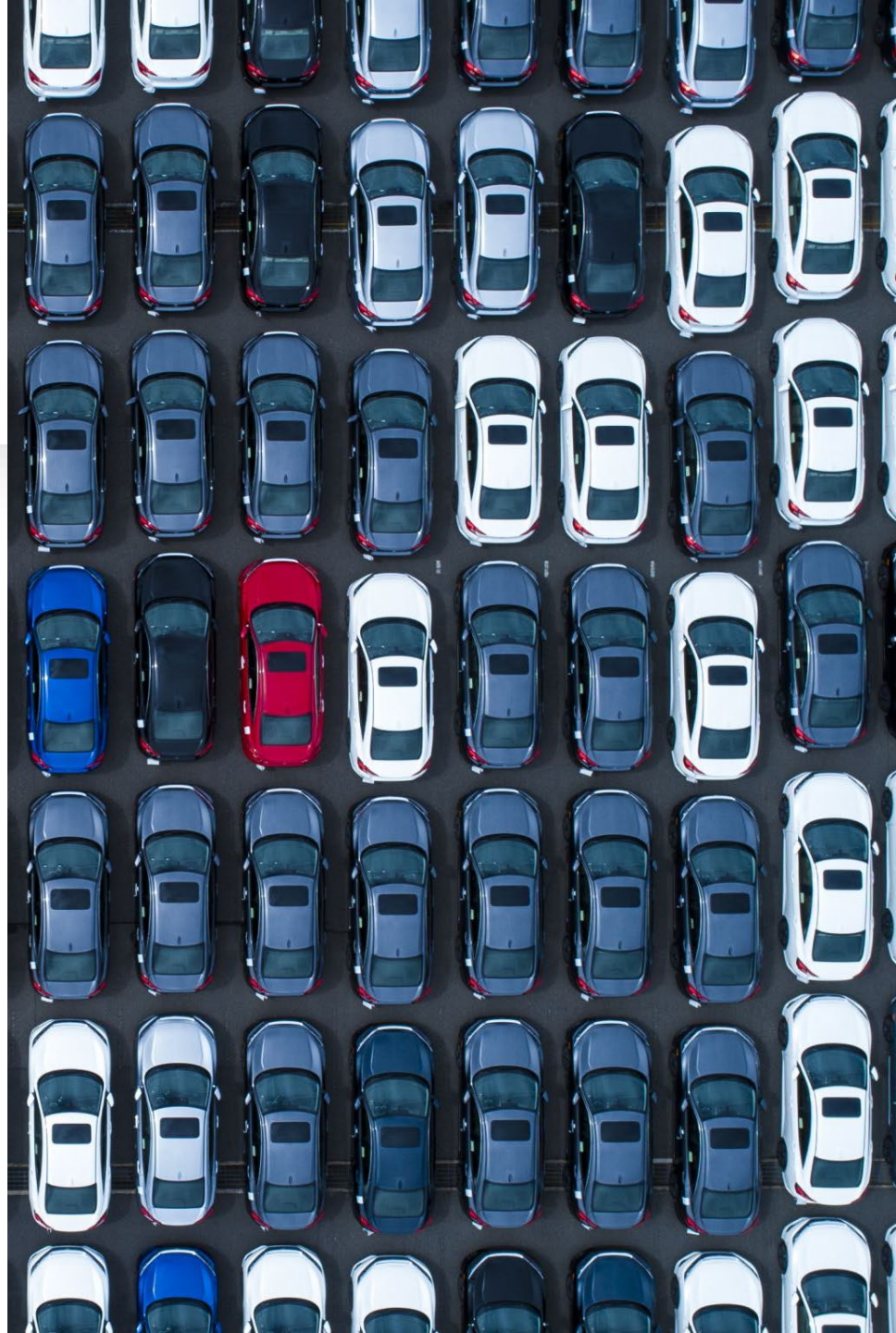

Why Vehicle Readiness Matters

- Dependable vehicles are essential for safety in both work and family life
- A few quick checks can prevent breakdowns, delays, and accidents
- Summer heat and long-distance travel add extra strain on vehicles and trailers





Vehicle Readiness Checklist

- Tires – Check tread depth and air pressure
- Coolant and Fluids – Ensure coolant, oil, and windshield washer fluid are topped off
- Emergency Supplies – Pack water, flashlight, jumper cables, and a first aid kit
- Spare Tire – Confirm it's present, inflated, and in usable condition

Trailer Readiness Checklist

- Tires – Inspect for wear and correct pressure, be mindful of age of tire
- Load securement – Yard waste, life jackets, bicycles
- Safety Chains – Ensure they're properly connected and not dragging [Fire Danger]
- Breakaway Battery and Brakes – Test for full functionality
- Wheel Bearings – Inspect and grease regularly
- Spare Tire – Make sure it's in good condition and accessible
