Home to the P'Squosa The Columbia River, including the Wenatchee Valley and these Coyote Dunes, have been home to the P'Squosa (Wenatchi Tribe) for thousands of years. P'Squosa people value this area for its abundant wildlife, fish, and plants.




Fishing area

This site overlooks an important fishing area to the P'Squosa people. Salmon, sturgeon and other fish species were caught in the river nearby for their sustenance and ceremonial needs.







Unrestricted Views This area of the Coyote Dunes was used by P'Squosa sentries for early detection of incoming travelers, both friend and foe, coming from the North, South and West. The natural elevated topography allowed unrestricted views of the Columbia and Wenatchee River migratory routes.
