

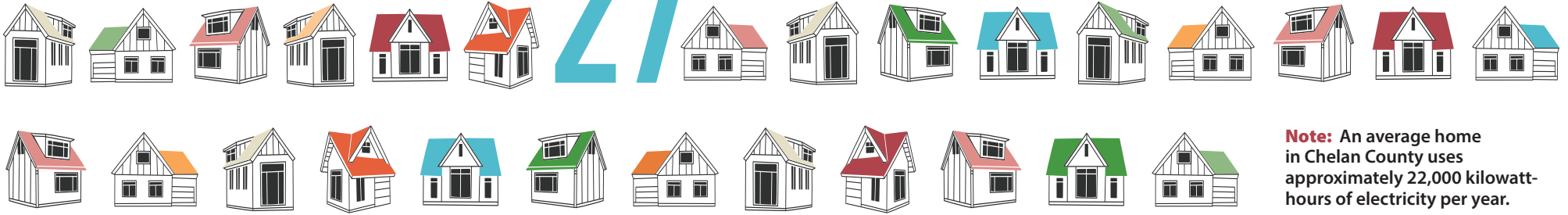
Check out the impact of SNAP contributions last year!

Since 2001, the Sustainable Natural Alternative Power (SNAP) program has connected customers who want to produce solar and wind power with other local customers who want to support the development of new, renewable energy.

Contributors voluntarily pay a little extra on their utility bills and this money goes to SNAP producers — individuals, schools and nonprofit agencies — that generate solar and wind power locally.

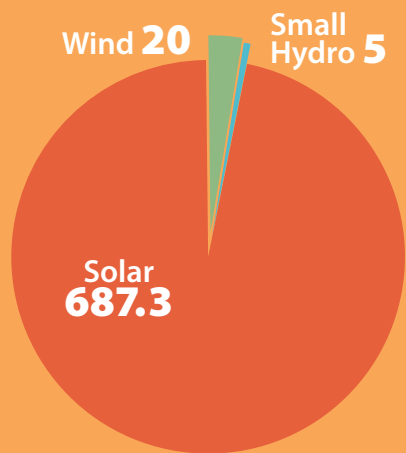

Together, SNAP contributions helped power the equivalent of almost **27** Chelan County homes last year

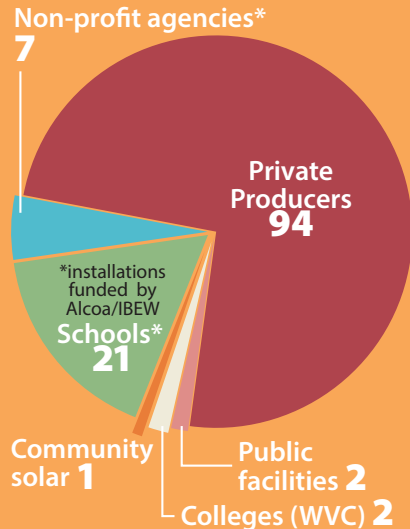


Note: An average home in Chelan County uses approximately 22,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity per year.

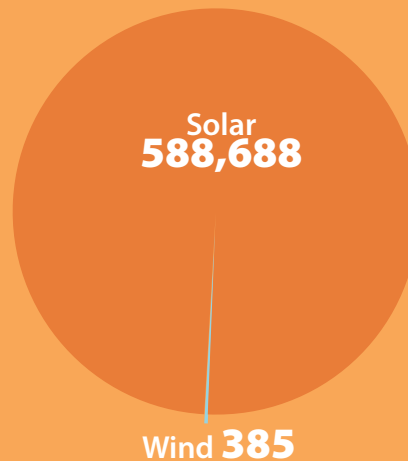
Capacity: 712.3 (kilowatts)



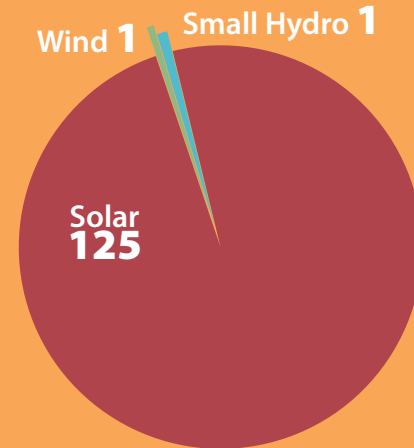
Number of SNAP Sites: 127
