Your support of the SNAP program is helping create more renewable power in our communities.

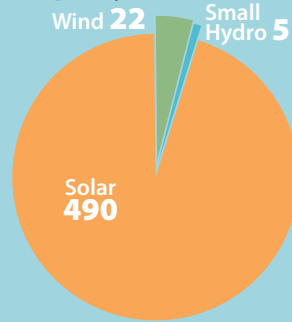

Together, SNAP contributions helped power the equivalent of **26** Chelan County homes last year

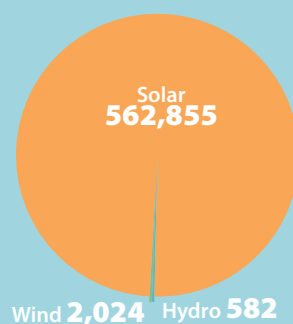


Note: An average home in Chelan County uses approximately 22,000 kilowatt-hours of electricity per year.

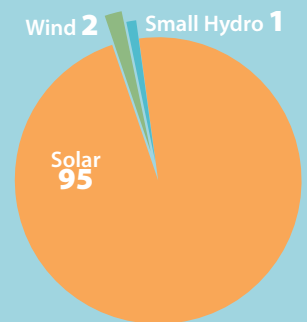
Capacity: 517 (in kilowatts)



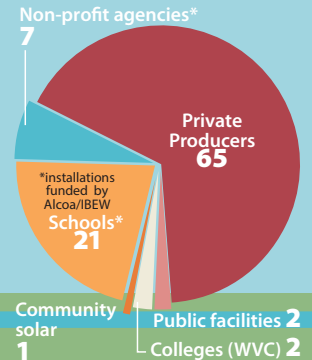
Generation: 565,461 (kilowatt-hours in year ending 3/31/21)
