

Notice Of Meeting by the Commission of Public Utility District Number 1 Of Chelan County On Development of A Conservation Potential Assessment Plan Under RCW 19.285.

To Interested Persons

The Board of Commissioners of the Chelan County PUD (Commission) hereby gives notice that it is initiating consideration of 10-year and two-year conservation targets as required under the State Energy Independence Act, also known as voter Initiative 937, as codified in RCW 19.285.

Per this notice, the Commission invites public participation in the meeting scheduled for 10:15 a.m. December 1, 2025, in the Commissioner's Boardroom at 203 Olds Station Road, Wenatchee. A staff presentation to the Commission on the District's conservation potential will also take place at 10 a.m. on November 17, 2025, also in the Commissioner's Boardroom.

Conservation Targets Background

RCW Chapter 19.285 imposes targets for energy conservation and use of eligible renewable resources on the state's electric utilities that serve more than 25,000 customers. The utilities must set and meet energy conservation targets.

Under the initiative, conservation is defined as any reduction in electric power consumption resulting from an increase in the efficiency of energy use, production, or distribution. Since Jan. 1, 2010, qualifying utilities have been required to begin acquiring all conservation that is cost-effective, reliable, and feasible as stated in the RCW Section 80.52.030. Each utility is required to set an annual target consisting of a certain share of this achievable cost-effective conservation potential and to meet that share of conservation. The determination of the utility conservation target must be consistent with the methodologies used by the Northwest Power and Conservation Council.

Under the initiative, a utility must identify its achievable cost-effective conservation potential. Every two years the utility must review and update its 10-year assessment. Each impacted utility must establish a biennial acquisition target and meet that target during the subsequent two-year period. The two-year target cannot be less than the pro rata share for that two-year period of its cost effective conservation potential for the next 10 years.
